A historian of the nineteenth-century United States, Dr. Casper is the author of *Sarah Johnson's Mount Vernon: The Forgotten History of an American Shrine* and *Constructing American Lives: Biography and Culture in Nineteenth-Century America*. He has held research fellowships at the National Humanities Center and the Virginia Foundation for the Humanities, among other institutions. He currently serves on the Executive Committee of the Delegates to the American Council of Learned Societies and edits the annual "Textbooks and Teaching" section of the *Journal of American History*. Dr. Casper earned his A.B. degree in History from Princeton University and his M.A., M.Phil., and Ph.D. degrees in American Studies from Yale University.

Co-author of *Shifting: The Double Lives of Black Women in America*, which is a winner of the 2004 American Book Awards, and a Fellow of the American Psychological Association, Dr. Shorter-Gooden has presented and published on African American women and identity, psychotherapy with diverse populations, and multicultural and diversity issues in higher education. From 2012 to 2016, she served as the first Chief Diversity Officer of the University of Maryland, College Park. She is also a licensed psychologist who has had a clinical and consultation practice. Originally from Washington, D.C., Dr. Shorter-Gooden was one of two Black girls to integrate the Madeira School, and she received a bachelor's degree magna cum laude from Princeton University with its first class of women. She earned a Ph.D. in Clinical/Community Psychology from University of Maryland, College Park.
